I declare and acknowledge the following:

- Boats, trailers and all vehicles are appropriately insured and meet safety standards as required by the relevant law
- All drivers of boats and vehicle adhere to the relevant road and marine rules and laws

The following points are put in place for the safety, comfort and enjoyment of all attendees of the event. Through respect for all involved and connected to the event, Ski for Life can continue to deliver this iconic and important event.

- Teams are responsible for enabling all persons to sleep on grassed areas, with the exception of campers, caravans, roof top tents. (Camp maps provided, detail the number of participants expected in each area over the course of the event).
- Participants sleeping arrangements take precedence over vehicles at grassed campsites

- Boats are to be parked away from campsites, at allocated areas.
- Teams are responsible for securing valuables at all times.
- Trackers are hired, as a result teams are responsible for the replacement cost if trackers are lost or broken.
- Please return trackers, maps and magnets at the conclusion of the event.
- Please follow the instructions of Ski for Life committee members and volunteers.
- Ski for Life committee members and volunteers will be co-ordinating parking at various locations and assisting at boat ramps, please allocate drivers competent at reversing trailers at these locations.
- Assist in the removal of all rubbish when leaving any location
- As representatives of Ski for Life, please be respectful towards other participants, road and river users and the general public.
- Group allocations have been created to reduce the need to overtake on the river. Team captains need to liaise with each other to determine the departure order. Teams can move between groups to accommodate the experience of the skiers at the time.
- Attendance at the nightly briefing is essential and should include the drivers of boats and vehicles for the following day
